2021 Grants

Since January 1998, ITC has awarded \$2,399,404 in 206 separate grants. The most recent grants were awarded to:

- Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center \$25,000
- Lighthouse Youth Services \$10,000
- Parachute CASA \$6,800
- GLAD House \$10,000
- Child Advocacy Warren County \$10,000

Total: \$61,800



Because of our low general expenses, 97% of your donations go directly to local social agencies and to the benefit of deserving kids. We are dedicated to the short-term goal of a measurable reduction in the number of reported child abuses cases and to the long-term goal of eliminating child abuse and neglect in our society. We look for grants that fund specific programs that fit with our mission and make the biggest difference.

Our grant funded individual trauma therapy for youth who entered Mecum House and were identified as being in crisis. The Mecum House provides a safe haven for youth ages 10-17 who are physically or sexually abused, neglected or for some other reason believe they can't safely be in their own homes.



On their first day at Mecum House, youth experiencing crisis were referred to a licensed clinical social worker. Previously, youth without insurance could not receive therapy, but ITC's grant allowed these youth to be served immediately. Once the initial visit occurred, the therapist then determined if further therapy sessions were necessary and provided recommendations to be implemented to positively impact the youth's stay at the shelter. In just six months of the program funded by ITC, 44 youths who have experienced trauma, abuse and neglect have been positively affected.



Our grant supported Glad House's Champs Prevention Program. Champs is an intensive after-school and summer program for children age 5-12 who have a caregiver who lives with addiction. Children with parents who abuse substances are three times more likely to be abused, and more than four times as likely to be neglected. The program provides individual, group, and family treatment, as well as prevention education through safe and fun experiences. Champs serves 27 children in three treatment groups at one time and serves approximately 55 children annually. ITC's grant allowed Glad House to provide in-person services, such as providing healthy meals, homework help, a behavior modification reward store and two group leaders per treatment group to facilitate the prevention program.
